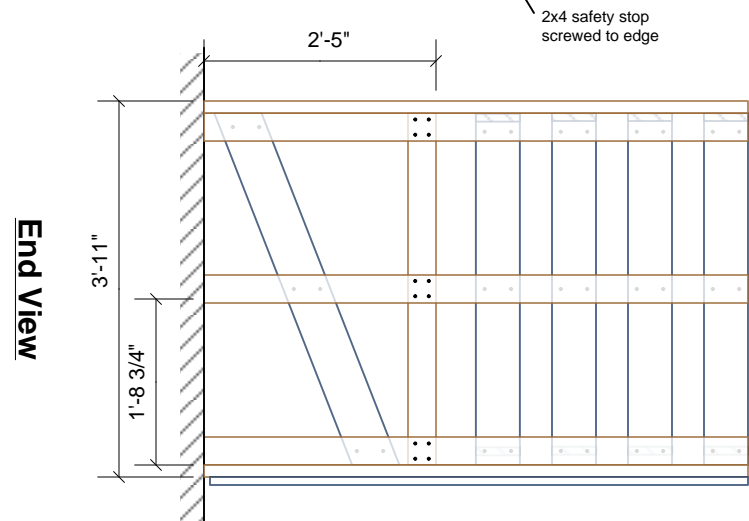
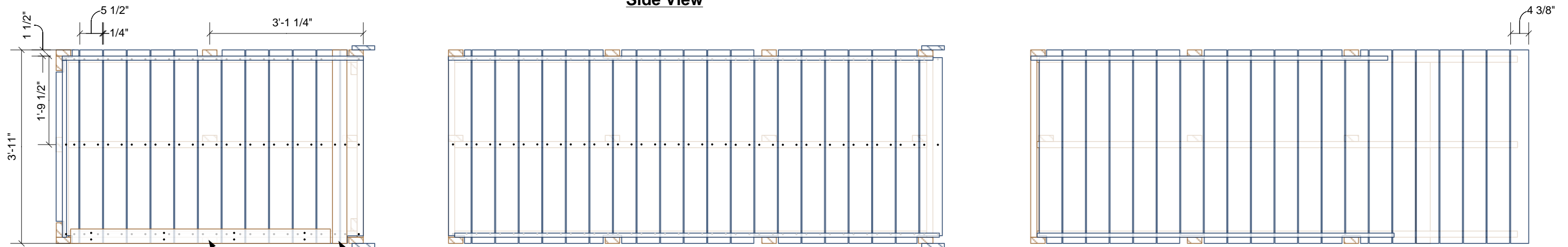
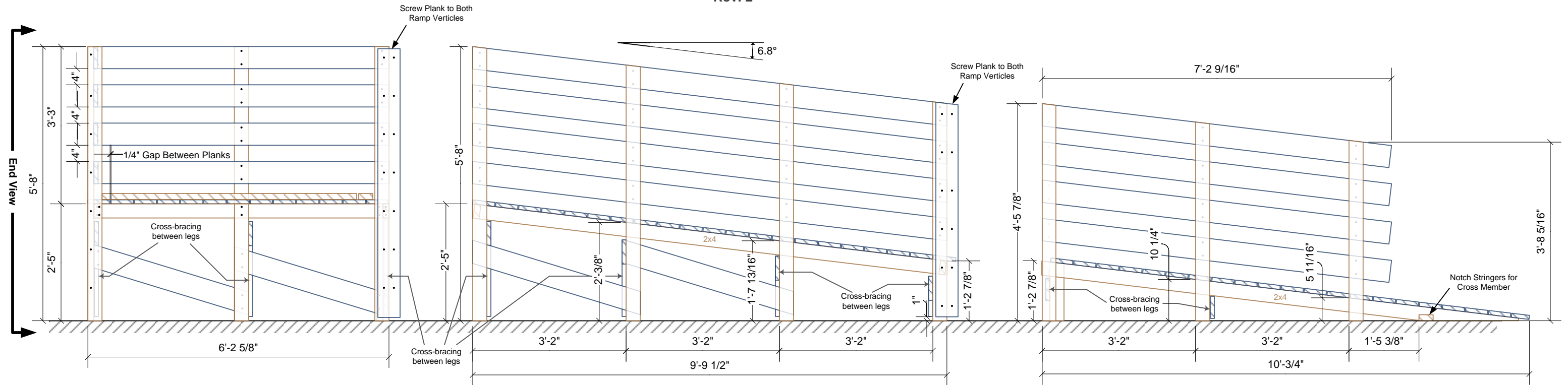

2x4 safety stop left floating to be removed while accessing platform, then set in place to prevent wheelchair from rolling back down ramp

23	5/4" x 6" x 12' PT Deck Planks
19	5/4" x 6" x 10' PT Deck Planks
12	5/4" x 6" x 8' PT Deck Planks
24	2" x 4" x 12' PT Studs
6	2" x 4" x 10' PT Studs
500	2" Deck Screws
300	3" Deck Screws



Note: These plans can be used either exactly as drawn or as a guideline for your particular needs. The location where we built our mounting platform had a slight slope to it, so the ramp length ended up being about six feet shorter than what is shown for when level land is available, while retaining the designed ramp angle (see photo). Also, Sally decided that she wanted the safety rail on the mounting side to only be 18" high so that a helper can more easily access the handicapped rider.
